WAWA EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

A goal of the New Jersey Food Council (“NJFC”) is to provide scholarships to students, who are employees and/or families of NJFC member companies and staff. This program will provide member benefit investment in the future of the food industry and families of NJFC.

ELIGIBILITY

Those eligible to apply are **New Jersey resident** high school seniors or college students who are either:

1. Children or spouses of full-time or part-time employees of **Wawa**. The employee must have been employed by Wawa for at least one year as of January 1 of the year in which the Wawa Education Development Scholarship Program (“Wawa Scholarship Program”) is awarded.
2. Full-time and part-time employees of **Wawa**, who have been employed by Wawa for at least six months as of January 1 of the year in which the Wawa Scholarship Program is awarded.

NOTE:

- The applicant or the parent(s)/spouse of the applicant must still be employed by **Wawa** at the time the winner is selected.
- Graduate students are not eligible for the Wawa Scholarship Program.

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

1. Wawa Scholarship Program – Two awards of \$2,500 to an employee or family member employed at Wawa.

The winners of the Wawa Scholarship Program may reapply each year if they or their parent(s)/spouse continue to be employed by Wawa. An average grade of B or better must be attained and confirmed.

The Wawa Scholarship Program may be used at any accredited college, university or professional school in the United States. The Wawa Scholarship Program recipient may transfer from one college to another and retain the Wawa Scholarship Program.

SELECTION OF WINNERS

A NJFC Selection Committee (“Committee”) will meet in the Spring of the year in which the Wawa Scholarship Program is awarded, to select the winner. In evaluating the applicants, the Committee considers the applicants’ grades, written essay, letter of recommendation and financial need. Students must be in good standing and free from disciplinary actions.

The winner is selected largely on the basis of academic merit with a B average or better, essay, letter of

recommendation and financial need (demonstration of special financial need is weighted higher). All applicants are notified of the results by the end of May of the year in which the Wawa Scholarship Program is awarded.

OBTAINING A SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

On or about the beginning of January of the year in which the Wawa Scholarship Program is awarded, Wawa is provided copies of the Wawa Scholarship Program Policy and Application Form. Applications are sent to those who request them or the application can be downloaded online at www.njfoodcouncil.com. The application and program policy contain instructions about deadlines and other important information. **Deadline for submission of applications is April 20, 2018.**

RESPONSIBILITIES OF RECIPIENTS

The Wawa Scholarship Program recipient must enroll as a full-time college student in the Fall of the year in which the Wawa Scholarship Program is awarded and, to continue in school for the entire academic year without interruption, barring illness, emergency or military service. The Wawa Scholarship Program check is mailed to the Wawa Scholarship Program winner, and she or he is responsible for making certain that the check is delivered to the college.

PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

The scholarship payment is made in the following way. On or about July 15 of the year in which the Wawa Scholarship Program is awarded, the Wawa Scholarship Program recipient is sent a check for the academic term. The check is made payable to the college.
